

4. NATIONAL ARM TRANSFER DATA COLLECTION AND REPORT-ING IN SAMOA

The Voluntary Trust Fund (VTF) Project committee, Producer director—Phillip Albert, Development DirectorGee Alister, Criminal Intelligent Divison—Garry (Australia) and Stued Mclachan—I.T, held it meeting at the SPS Conference Room. This project is to help Samoa to have an automated centralised system called the National Arms Transfer Database (NATD), which will allow for a quick and efficient extraction of information relating to firearms & trade.
