1. Nafanua II - 1 year of service celebration



The Commissioner of Police and Nafanua II crew with the presence of Australian Maritime Surveillance Advisor celebrated one year since the Police Patrol Boat funded by Australia Government, has been handed over to the Samoa Police Service in replacement of the old Nafanua Patrol Boat.

The vessel was gifted mainly for maritime surveillance, search and rescue operations and for the inspection of ships that may cross our Exclusive Economic Zone (EEZ) if they are performing illegal fishing or smuggling drugs and other prohibited objects.
