
# Greetings & Talofa lava.

An acknowledgement has been made to our community for handing in these illegal weapons without any charges laid for possessing such.

The official welcoming of new recruits.

At the beginning of this month, our ministry welcomed our new recruits to be part of us. It consists of more than fifty people who could make it through the last phase of recruitment process and it includes four trainees from Prisons & Corrections.



# Constable Enhancement Course 2020 for Recruitment of 2018.

Two groups from recruits of 2018 have undergone the Constable Enhancement Course as they completed years of probation. This course has been designed to provide our police officers with enhanced training and skills in the execution of our daily duties and to remind them of how the law is lawfully enforced in order to minimize complaints from the community for the poor performance of our duties as law enforcers.







### **Defensive Driving Course**

The Ministry of Police, Prisons & Corrections evolved Defensive Driving Course as one of the numerous responsibilities carried out within the ministry, and there are qualified Police Instructors working under Training Unit who are responsible for training every member of the Ministry including Prisons & Corrections Officers holding valid driver's license for a duration of two weeks.

This significant course has developed the trainees to become cautious by learning the techniques and taking proactive actions to reduce car collision and to be aware of possible hazards when driving. It is also one of the Commissioner's initiatives to minimize car accidents involving vehicles of the Ministry.

So far, there are 45 trainings conducted since the commencement of Defensive Driving Course in 2017 and that resulted in 230 qualified drivers including 16 qualified drivers from Prisons & Corrections.
