If you are interested in serving the people of Samoa as a police officer and you meet the following minimum entry requirements, you are encouraged to apply.

Minimum entry requirements:

- 1. Must be at least 21 years of age by due date of application
- 2. Minimum tertiary qualification
- 3. Must be able to speak and write fluently in both Samoan and English
- 4. Must be a Samoan citizen
- 5. Must have basic Computing Skills (Ms Word Processing, Excel, PowerPoint)
- 6. Must be physically able to participate in all physical fitness programs
- 7. Must not have any previous or pending criminal convictions
- 8. Preferred to hold a valid driver's license.
- 9. Must have a high level of moral integrity and commitment to duty and service
- 10. Must have the ability to work effectively with staff and contribute to team activities.

Selection Criteria:

In additional to the above, applicants who meet the above minimum requirements will be assessed against the following competencies required of a police recruit:

- 1. Must hold a minimum Tertiary qualification with the following competencies;
- 2. Interpersonal Skills
- 3. Personal Impact
- 4. Observational Skills
- 5. Ethics and Integrity
- 6. Attention to detail
- 7. Adherence to authority
- 8. Communication Skills
- 9. Applies Reason
- 10. Interviewing Skills
- 11. Perseverance

Role of a Constable

The job of a constable involve duties as an operational police officer, performing shift work under any conditions or circumstances in any location in Samoa to fulfill policing requirements in the maintenance of law and order, preservation of peace, protection of life and property, prevention, detection and investigation of crime and enforcement of law throughout Samoa.

Assessment:

The recruitment and selection process will also involve comprehensive integrity and character checks, computer, physical and aptitude testing, and an interview, which will be conducted at the Police Headquarters in Apia or any approved venue.

Successful applicants will undergo a 15 - 20 weeks Basic Recruit Course at the Training Section in Matautu before they are sworn in as probationary constables for a period of two years.

During the two years probationary period, the Recruits are required to undergo the Field Phase Program and demonstrate they are competent in all aspects of policing duties and are worthy of becoming permanent sworn members of the Ministry of Police, Prisons & Corrections.
